## Pastor's Message

#### In the Nick of Time!

Dear Friends in Christ,

While Lutherans do not pray to saints, we do remember their lives of faith. Most notable for Luther was Mary, the mother of our Lord, whose feast day we do have on Lutheran calendars, August 15.

I mention this because December 6 is the feast day of another notable saint, St. Nicholas of Myra (present-day Turkey in the 300's). While we don't know much about this man, church historians believe he gave away much of his inherited wealth to help the poor.

The title of this article, In the Nick of Time, purposely plays on a pun using St. Nicholas's name. His feast day is close enough to the beginning of Advent, enabling me to join the two ideas, and say that Advent comes in the nick of time. Each year we are tempted to get caught up in the insanity of pre-Christmas preparations. But Advent comes to the church and to our lives to help us set priorities. Through the blue season of the church year, a color that resembles dawn, the break of a new day, Advent calls us to wake from the sleep that commercialism lulls us into. In this season, through prayer, worship and works of mercy, we ready ourselves for the priority – proclaiming that God has come to humanity in Jesus Christ, born of Mary.

And so, by mentioning Mary again, this newsletter article comes full circle. Let Advent be a time when we, like Mary the Mother of Our Lord and St. Nicholas, give of ourselves to the work of the church: the worship of God and care for the poor. Lighting the Advent wreath each Sunday reminds us that this circle of greenery and light resemble the life of Christ -- it has no end. This is the gift he gives us through the cross and empty tomb – things the manger ready us for, if we are alert and sense Christ among us in this season of preparation.

Blessed Advent, and peace to you as we worship Christ on his Nativity in the season of Christmas (Dec. 24-Jan. 6).

## **Worship Notes**

Hymns

There is a lot of planning to worship that may not be entirely obvious. To help us appreciate the depth of the liturgy, I've decided to write a short monthly column about worship.

The first topic is hymns. Hymns are not chosen based on popularity or what we might know or not know. Instead, each piece is chosen based on the theme of the Bible readings for that Sunday. Music underscores the biblical message of the day. For example, if the gospel reading for the day is the feeding of the multitude, the hymns selected would dwell on God's providence, the sacraments, and how creation (crops, rain) sustains humanity.

The Music and Worship committee meets each month to choose the Sunday hymns. We use three manuals to help us: Worship Indexes, Sundays and Seasons, and The Manual on the Liturgy. These books categorize hymns by theme as proclaimed by the scripture readings for each Sunday of the church year.

We choose hymns to give the best voice to the Bible. If a hymn is not well known but follows an easy tune, we will still incorporate it into worship. If it is not entirely easy, we may rehearse it two or three Sundays in the announcements before we use it, or the choir will learn it and sing it as an anthem first. Congregations cannot only use well known hymns, for the message of Scripture will resound in us more often when the word and music resonate together.
